A SOLIDARY FESTIVAL ACCESSIBILITY

True to its commitment to being an event open to everyone, Quais du Polar has made welcoming individuals with disabilities a priority. Since 2022, the festival's teams have worked on improving accessibility and inclusivity for all audiences. The adaptation of festival signage and the establishment of an accessibility hub, consisting of team members and volunteers reachable in advance by phone or email, have ensured an experience tailored to each individual. Quais du Polar's programme has also been made more accessible by offering eight conferences translated into French sign language, as well as sessions dedicated to raising awareness about books published in large print and those adapted for individuals with dyslexia. To disseminate this information to the relevant audiences. Ouais du Polar has reached out to more than 40 associations, organisations, and specialised media outlets, both locally and nationally. These fruitful exchanges have and will continue to contribute to improving access to culture for all.

This year, thanks to the support of the DRAC Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes and the Auvergne Rhône-Alpes Region, specific actions will be implemented before and during the festival:

• 8 meetings will be translated into French Sign Language live with the assistance of specialized FSL interpreters.

- Some venues will also be equipped with hearing loops for hearing aid users.
- A departure for the Great Investigation reserved for deaf people (accompanied by FSL interpreters) will take place on Saturday, April 6th, at 1 p.m.

• A designated contact person and a team of trained volunteers will be assigned to provide information in advance and assistance during the event to those who wish upon their arrival from the metro, bus, or other means of transportation, throughout their journey at the festival venues (conferences, Great Bookshop, etc.).

All our venues are accessible to people with reduced mobility and comply with PMR standards.

AN ENVIRONMENTALLY RESPONSIBLE EVENT

Quais du Polar is environmentally conscious and has been working towards limiting its carbon footprint and waste production for years. All of our service providers and suppliers are local businesses, the festival limits paper printing, and prioritises train travel for French and European guests. Quais du Polar is continuously exploring new solutions to implement long-term actions, focusing on paper sourcing and the website's carbon footprint, among other things.

FREE ADMISSION

Access to the main venues of the festival, conferences, meetings, and youth activities is free within the limit of available seats. Upon presentation of the membership card to the Quais du Polar association, festivalgoers benefit from easier access to each conference! (Except for film screenings, literary cruises, and some "echo to the festival" events).

A LOOK BACK AT THE PREVIOUS EDITION

THE 2023 EDITION IN NUMBERS:

- 130 authors present in Lyon (18 nationalities represented)
- 90,000 festivalgoers
- 15,000 participants in Quais du Polar's Great Investigation, including 2,000 pupils

• **29,800+ followers on Facebook** (2nd largest literary event behind the Angoulême International Comics Festival)

- 8,400+ followers on Instagram (+82% since 2022)
- 500+ articles in the written and digital press
- 200 cultural events across Lyon and the region
- 30 partner towns

THE BIGGEST NOIR EVENT IN FRANCE AND EUROPE

As the biggest festival dedicated to crime fiction in France and Europe, Quais du Polar has become one of the most important events in the world of books. It is THE unmissable gathering for crime fiction enthusiasts in Europe and owes its vitality to its unique format in the realm of literary events:

• A festival that showcases the latest in crime fiction publishing, with an open approach to crime fiction in its broadest sense, from noir novels to thrillers, and allows for numerous forays into general fiction, comics, and young adult literature.

• Recognizing that crime fiction is also an asset for attracting new audiences to literary and cultural events, Quais du Polar strives to diversify its programming as much as possible, offering a wide range of activities including literature, cinema, music, exhibitions, series, theatre, and games.

- A festival open to the City and Metropolitan area of Lyon and the Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes Region.
- An event that offers new and unique playful experiences for festivalgoers: city-wide investigation, museum treasure hunt, escape game, and more.

• A literary event where the greatest crime fiction authors from around the world gather each year in a friendly atmosphere.

Beyond its public image, Quais du Polar is first and foremost a civic festival that advocates for access to culture for all by offering free admission and activities aimed at audiences furthest from culture and literature. Education is also a significant aspect of the festival, through initiatives such as combating illiteracy (Dictées Noires in collaboration with the National Agency for the Fight Against Illiteracy) and various educational activities tailored to different age groups.

Furthermore, Quais du Polar has also become a reference in the professional sphere, offering an annual training programme for teachers and librarians in partnership with the ENSSIB (National School of Library and Information Science), and a programme of professional meetings, Polar Connection, bringing together professionals from the book industry, audiovisual sector, and broader cultural sector. The festival has also committed to promoting international professional exchanges and showcasing French-language crime fiction abroad. For several years, it has been collaborating with the French Institute, partnering with literary events in various countries (Italy, Germany, Romania, China, India, South Korea) to highlight Francophone authors.

True to its commitments and convictions, the Quais du Polar team continues to develop along these various axes, looking back with satisfaction at the progress made and eagerly anticipating a future that is equally rich in exchanges, encounters, and global outreach.

THE MONTH OF NOIR

QUAIS DU POLAR RENEWS ITS "MONTH OF NOIR" OPERATION IN APRIL

Over the years, Quais du Polar has had a growing impact on promoting crime fiction, by creating a "noir season" during which publishers release new titles, foreign authors go on tour, bookstores organize events around the genre, and major French media outlets publish special crime fiction features. This season has helped to highlight the literary genre, which is now a favourite among French readers', with nearly 22 million books sold each year in France.

The objective of the "**MONTH OF NOIR**" initiative is to perpetuate the "noir spirit" beyond the Quais du Polar festival, to promote the genre and celebrate it throughout the month of April on a national scale. This will involve specific communication and a comprehensive programme dedicated to this "Month of Noir" in line with the programming of the 2024 edition. It will also include our selections of recent crime fiction titles, book signings, events taking place in bookshops throughout the month, publisher initiatives, and some key activities related to the genre.

The "**Libraires Ensemble**" group of independent bookshops, with its network of 44 bookshops across France, will be our privileged partner for this initiative. They will host some of the festival's guest authors, especially foreign authors, who can make the most of their visit to France by participating in meetings and book signings at partner bookshops.

As Robin cook once said "April months are murderous".



INTERNATIONAL ENGAGEMENT

For the 20th consecutive year, Lyon transforms into an international hub for literary and cultural professionals for the duration of the festival. This global convergence fosters exchanges and the birth of new projects. Supported by the agreement between the French Institute, the City, and the Metropolitan area of Lyon, Quais du Polar showcases French-language crime fiction and its authors worldwide, exploring Book Cities/Crime Fiction Cities and the UNESCO Creative Cities Network.

Through regular exchanges, we welcome publishers, literary event organisers, and international cultural leaders, paving the way for project development in their respective countries. Collaborations commence right here in Lyon this spring, with professionals from Prague, Reykjavik, Manchester, Vilnius, Athens, Barcelona, or Milan contributing significantly to the festival's international prominence.

We also observe or support initiatives worldwide, echoing the exchanges that occur in Lyon, in close collaboration with the French cultural network abroad and local partners, to promote and disseminate authors' works.

IN ENGLAND

For instance, in this context, Quais du Polar has initiated collaborative writing experiments between two authors, one French and the other from a crime fiction city. Their Collaborative Crime Novels collection, with the collaboration of Points publishers, is already underway. *The Steve McQueen* by Tim Willocks and Caryl Férey, set between Manchester and Lyon, will be presented this year in this vein.

NOIR IN MUMBAI, INDIA

Projects developed with Mumbai or Barcelona continue to yield results in subsequent years, with a second edition of Noir in Mumbai and the invitation of the authors of *L'inconnue du Port*, Olivier Truc and Rosa Montero, to the BCNegra 2024 festival in Barcelona.

IN GENEVA

From March 6th to 10th, 2024, Quais du Polar is present at the Geneva Book Fair with a programme featuring the presence of 15 authors and the organisation of around ten meetings on crime fiction. These various meetings bring together Ian Manook and Nicolas Verdan for dark literary journeys; Patricia Tourancheau and Fabrice Epstein on criminal reality and the secrets of justice; Niko Tackian and Nicolas Lebel on the backstage of their writing process and their secrets to bringing their plots to life; Caryl Férey, Morgan Audic, and their narratives that blend suspense with nature and animal advocacy; Laurent Joffrin and Olivier Truc, two journalists turned crime fiction authors; and Hervé Le Corre, a prominent figure in Francophone crime fiction who combines fine writing with social engagement.

POLAR CONNECTION

11TH EDITION !

Quais du Polar's professional programme unfolds over three intense days, fostering exchanges on current topics, sharing inspiring experiences, and fostering connections around crime fiction projects to develop. It brings together professionals from France and abroad whose activities are influenced by crime fiction. From April 5th to 7th, 2024, Polar Connection offers accredited professionals:

• A dedicated gathering point for accredited professionals: conference rooms and individual meeting spaces or friendly cocktail times at the heart of the festival, at the Palais de la Bourse;

• A specific programme of roundtable discussions, workshops, presentations on professional topics, and the presentation of the SCELF - Polar en Series award;

- Tailored "Extras" events for participants, with involved partners;
- Privileged access to festival events, a source of inspiration.

ON THE PROGRAMME FOR CRIME FICTION PROFESSIONALS

Meetings with publishers and book professionals from Book Cities/Crime Fiction Cities as well as the UNESCO Creative Cities of Literature network. This is an opportunity to explore identifying new voices in crime fiction internationally or to share experiences on the dynamics created by this network.

The programme will draw from the genre's current topics and the industry's questions: key figures from two studies by CNL and SOFIA; the role of the paperback format in showcasing authors; contributions from Police/Justice experts in the narrative process.

Tim Willocks and Caryl Férey will shed light on their collaborative writing process, alongside translator Benjamin Legrand and publisher Natalie Beunat. Presentations of new releases from 8 French publishing houses on Saturday morning. Also, a special weekend programme dedicated to literary influencers.

Bridges with cinema and the audiovisual realm during case studies of series adapted from novels. Three guest authors will engage in a comparative approach to literary and audiovisual writing. Added to these are all the individual meetings, contacts, and dedicated cocktail meetings for networking.

SCELF - POLAR EN SERIES AWARD

A highlight of Friday's agenda, the Polar en Series award was designed, with the support of the Civil Society of French-Language Publishers (SCELF), to be part of the Polar Connection programme. It creates bridges between the literary and audiovisual realms by rewarding a work for its intrinsic qualities and its potential for adaptation into a series. The award will be presented for its 10th edition in 2024 in the company of a jury of cinema and audiovisual professionals, who will also speak at a meeting about the challenges of adaptation.

THE QDP TALENT POOL

Many young or future professionals in the book and audiovisual industries, passionate about crime fiction, gravitate around the festival, especially among volunteers or partnering training organizations. Some professionals present at Polar Connection will be called upon to meet them and discuss their profession, practices, and motivations. This tailor-made programme aims to transmit experiences and enthusiasm for crime fiction, to present the professions of these sectors, and to create links between young people in training and professionals.

• Literary bus tours through the city streets to meet those who experience first-hand what makes us shiver in noir novels on a daily basis: authors and experts in profiling, investigation, and INTERPOL with Lyon City tour.

• The Lyon Judicial Court will host two meetings on the theme of justice and investigation: Cold cases and old legal affairs (with Chris De Stoop, Fabrice Epstein, Michelle Fines, J.-M. Pottier) and about investigators who take up the pen (with Marie-Laure Brunel-Dupin, Angélina Delcroix, François Molins, Bernard Petit).

Original proposals

• **Noir Dictations** in partnership with the National Agency for the Fight against Illiteracy: Marion Brunet will address students, and on Friday at the Comédie Odéon cinema, actress Virginie Ledoyen will be invited to dictate a noir text to the general public.

• **Reading sessions:** Lizzie and Quais du Polar offer a reading time of excerpts from noir novels by actors to dive into the world of suspense.

• Immersion in true crime with McSkyz: well-known on social media platforms where he publishes highly documented videos on news stories, McSkyz will premiere his new video. The screening will be followed by a Q&A session.


• Quais du Polar will inaugurate this year a partnership with the "Ça Presse" festival, the International Press Drawing Meetings, by proposing a meeting on the theme of humour with 5 authors illustrated live by press cartoonists Lara and Lacombe.

THE COLLABORATIVE CRIME NOVEL

Quais du Polar and Éditions Points share a collaborative writing project connecting two authors, two cities, two countries... A new project emerges between Lyon and Manchester.

It fits into a collection initiated by a first novel, *Le Coffre*, written by Romanian author Lucian-Dragos Bogdan and French author Jacky Schwartzmann in 2019. Then came *Terminus Leipzig*, written by German author Max Annas and French author Jérôme Leroy in 2022, and last year *L'inconnue du port* by Spanish author Rosa Montero and French author Olivier Truc.

In 2024, *Le Steve McQueen* is the result of collaboration between British author Tim Willocks and French author Caryl Férey. They have joined their voices and talent to write this rock & roll and tender epic, between Manchester and Lyon, infused with devastating humour. They will present it at Quais du Polar, alongside translator Benjamin Legrand and editor Natalie Beunat.



The writing project for this novel was initiated by the international festival Quais du Polar, in collaboration with Éditions Points. It is supported by the Institut français / Ville et Métropole de Lyon Convention.

The Cité de la Gastronomie will host both authors for a brunch, prepared by a Franco-British chef duo, for an original exchange between Lyon and Manchester, between gastronomy and literature. In partnership with the Métropole de Lyon.

NOIR ECHOES

Since its inception, Quais du Polar has partnered with numerous cultural institutions in Lyon and the region on various projects related to noir and crime literature. This programme reflects the shared desire to extend the popular and festive dimension of the event and to be close to the audiences. Each year, meetings, conferences, and book signings are organised in the city, metropolitan area, and region. This year, more than 70 organisations are joining forces with the festival, offering just as many events leading up to and during the festival.

IN MUSEUMS AND LIBRARIES

This year, Quais du Polar and the Museum of Fine Arts of Lyon are joining forces to celebrate the 20th edition of the festival together during an evening rich in events: investigations, conferences, conversations with authors. The Museum of Printing and Graphic Communication will host a guided tour on the transformations of reading, and an investigation tour for the whole family. The Museum of Moulages will offer two activities in the form of puzzles throughout the museum, starting from 8 years old. The exhibition "Friends in Love and War - In Praise of the Best Enemies," currently on display at the **macLYON**, is honoured through the visit of Val McDermid, who will present one of the works during a conversation with a museum mediator.

Libraries and media libraries in **Lyon and its metropolitan area** will host numerous activities echoing the 20th edition of the festival. On the agenda: film screenings, board game evenings, giant police investigations, and murder parties organised by Mortelle Soirée, and also meetings, book signings, conferences with Franck Bouysse, Céline Denjean, Piergiorgio Pulixi, Caryl Férey, Pétronille Rostagnat, Henri Lœvenbruck, Michel Bussi, Abir Mukherjee, Karine Giebel, Olivier Bordaçarre, Bernard Minier, Manon Gauthier-Faure, Jørn Lier Horst, Cécile Cabanac, Benoît Philippon...

AT ASSOCIATED VENUES

Events around the noir genre will be held in various institutions associated with the festival: at the **Théâtre du Point du Jour**, the public can attend the general rehearsal of the play "Notre Procès" and become jurors in this participatory setup that raises questions about rape and the judicial system. At the **Théâtre de l'Elysée**, an exhibition will explore the ways in which video games appropriate the various codes of the noir genre, punctuated by playformances where people from diverse backgrounds will interpret a video game in front of an audience. At the **Marché Gare**, you can discover the universe of the legendary series *The Wire* during the opening of the eponymous exhibition, which plunges us into the heart of a striking portrait of Baltimore, an autopsy of a society where crime, politics, trafficking, and corruption coexist.

Finally, puzzles will be proposed by various partners such as escape games, giant investigations, and board game evenings before and during the festival, echoing the programme.

All information will be available in our programme and on our website in early March.

VISITS AND WALKS

Discover the professions of the **National School of Police** and the **National Forensic Police Service** throughout the festival! On the programme: open days, puzzles, participatory workshops, escape games, exchanges with laboratory experts and school students, and crime scene reenactments! Once again this year, **Only Lyon** will offer the guided tour "Crimes and True Crime in Lyon" over the three days of the festival, and **La Justice Racontée** will organise the walk "Chicago on Rhône, justice put to the test by thugs."

Lyon City Tour will also renew its bus tours through the city streets with justice experts.

GASTRONOMIE

120 years of Entente Cordiale between France and the United Kingdom will be celebrated during a "so British" brunch at the **Cité Internationale de Ia Gastronomie in Lyon**. On the menu, a culinary collaboration between Xavier Radojewski of the Ravigote restaurant in Lyon, and a chef from Manchester. In literature, Tim Willocks and Caryl Férey, co-authors of *The Steve McQueen*, will talk about their book written collaboratively on both sides of the English Channel.

CULTURAL MEDIATION

Since its inception, Quais du Polar has aimed to reach all audiences, especially those who are farthest from cultural practices.

EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

Throughout the year, Quais du Polar offers teachers the opportunity to integrate their classes into various projects related to crime fiction.

On **April 4th and 5th**, students from primary to high school will be able to participate in the Great Investigation and meet with guest authors at the festival. This year, authors such as Patrícia Melo, Bertrand Puard, Caryl Férey, Laurent Martin, Danielle Thiéry, and Alain Gagnol will engage with students about their career paths and works.

With the support of the City of Lyon, Quais du Polar will once again be awarding the **Quais du Polar Youth Award**. For this project, coordinated by the Ambassadors of the Book from Afev in classrooms, over 200 students will vote for their favourite book from a selection of 5 titles before presenting the award to the winner.

Middle school students can participate in the Young Readers' Short Story Contest organised this year in partnership with the Lyon Judicial Court, advocate for their favourite crime fiction novel in the Noir Battle, and create podcasts and articles about the festival by interviewing authors, booksellers, festival organizers, and members of the public. Additionally, for certain high school classes, these school events will be the culmination of year-long projects. Students will meet author Barbara Abel and producer Jacques-Henri Bronckart (subject to change) as part of the "One Book, One Film" project on audiovisual adaptation, while others will conclude their translation workshops by meeting writer S. A. Cosby.

Quais du Polar is also bringing back its **Noir Dictations**, in partnership with the National Agency for the Fight against Illiteracy. Marion Brunet will be invited to read and dictate an excerpt from her book *L'Ogre à poil(s)* to participating classes. Virginie Ledoyen, meanwhile, will host the Public Dictation.

QUAIS DU POLAR IN PRISON

For several years, with the support of the Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes Regional Directorate of Cultural Affairs and the Interregional Directorate of Prison Services (DISP) in Lyon, Quais du Polar has implemented the **"Noir Behind Bars"** programme to promote reading and the crime fiction genre in correctional facilities. Authors will visit penitentiary institutions in the Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes region to (re)introduce incarcerated individuals to crime and mystery literature. Meetings with detainees will be prepared in advance by teams from municipal and departmental libraries and the educational service of the institutions.

This year, volunteer inmates will once again participate in the Quais du Polar / Babelio Short Story Contest. For this purpose, writing workshops will be held with author Sébastien Gendron. Two correctional facilities will also participate in the Quais du Polar / Le Figaro Readers' Award jury. A special mention will be awarded to the novel from the selection that receives the most votes from them. With the support of Albin Michel, Le Rouergue, La Manufacture de livres, Gallimard, L'Aube, and HarperCollins.

QUAIS DU POLAR IN HOSPITAL

Once again this year, Quais du Polar is organising activities in hospital settings, hosting a meeting with Dominique Sylvain at the Henry Gabrielle Hospital in Saint-Genis-Laval, with Cécile Cabanac at the Croix-Rousse Hospital, and with Alain Gagnol at the Specialised School for Sick Children in Bron, in addition to a screening of the animated film "Nina and the Hedgehog's Secret". With the support of Fleuve Editions, Robert Laffont, Syros, and Little KMBO films.

TRAINING DAY

In collaboration with the Lyon Education Authority, the municipal library network of Lyon, and the DRAC Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes, Quais du Polar is organising a training day for teachers, librarians, and documentalists to raise awareness about crime fiction and provide them with ideas for working on the genre with both adults and children. It will take place on Thursday, April 4th, at ENSSIB (Villeurbanne). This year, the training day will highlight various current themes in the fields of publishing and literature, such as the visibility of translators in the age of artificial intelligence, the revitalisation of classic noir novels, the collaboration between an author and a translator, and the research involved in writing a book based on real events, as well as an overview of new adult and young adult crime

THE CLAUDE MESPLÈDE AWARD

Claude Mesplède was a publisher, critic, historian, and a knowledgeable and passionate crime fiction aficionado. He was also a loyal friend of Quais du Polar, having been involved in its inception and all its developments. He conducted invaluable work in spreading and transmitting a culture of crime fiction. To honour him and immortalise his work, we created the Claude Mesplède Award for non-fiction books on crime fiction. This award recognises a work that contributes to a better understanding of the genre, in the form of essays, historical works, correspondences, documents, investigations, translations, original editions of complete or unpublished works, or new translations.

The awards for the **Youth Short Story Contest** and the **Quais du Polar / Babelio Short Story Contest** will be presented with all the other awards.

The **European Crime Fiction Award** awarded by Le Point magazine will also be presented on this occasion.
